

Directors' Report

The summary of the main activities and services for the year 2016 is covered below

Onasadya and Onam Celebrations

Malayalees from across the UK celebrated Onam, commemorating the Great King Mahabali and the golden era under His reign. MAUK held two days of festivities to mark 2016 Onam. It commenced with the grand traditional feast, 'Ona Sadya' at the Trinity Centre, Manor Park, London on Saturday, 3 September. It was a day for all to dress up in traditional Kerala costumes and to enjoy the delicious vegetarian feast'. The traditional feast served on banana leaves with 17 homemade dishes was served in the traditional method.

The second day of celebration titled Swayam Ponnonam 2016 was held at Ilford Town Hall on Saturday, 17 September 2016. The five-hour variety cultural show that was held included homegrown artists as well as prominent artists from Kerala

The event started with the lighting the lamp followed by the welcome speech of Chairperson Mr Ravendran Nair. The cultural events featured a diverse line-up of dancers and musicians from the Malayalee community in in UK. Traditional performances like Maveli Varavelppu, Thiruvathira, classical dances, group dances, and Chendamelam were all performed by local talents.

The highlight of Onam celebrations was a three-hour live Ganamela by the famous playback singers Biju Narayanan, Jyotsna and Sreenath. The orchestra for the Ganamela was provided by MAUK's music troupe Nisari with Santosh on the keyboard, Vinod on tabla and percussion, Varun on drums and rhythm and Shino on bass guitar. The event has made more extravagant by the performance of internationally famous juggler from Kerala, Vinod Venjarammoode who has amazed the world with the highly skilled juggling tactics

MAUK thanked all the participants and volunteers who made the show successful. It was also another successful partnership event with Sangeetha of the UK, which enabled the singers from Kerala to perform for the Onam celebrations in two venues. MAUK will continue to



explore partnership opportunities that would benefit the community.

Chendamelam

In 2016, the MAUK Chenda Troupe has performed across the United Kingdom. The performances of the Troupe were well appreciated at the 65th Republic Day Celebration organised by the High Commission of India at the Grosvenor House Hotel in London. The team has continued to receive the accolade at the chariot festival organised by London Sree Murugan Temple and Sree Mahalakshmi Temple. The thousand of worshipers well received the five-hour-long procession through the streets of East London. The Troupe also performed at various churches festivals and celebrations. International Women's Day

International Woman's day was celebrated on 13 March at Kerala House with different varieties of programs. The celebration commenced with a speech by the chief guest, Prathibha Ramsigh OBE. Kattan Kaapiyum Kavithayum (KKK)

There were 8 episodes of KK held in 2016 with majority focusing on attaining wider knowledge of painting and modern art. The conclusion of the Art Project started in 2015 and Art Exhibition took place in February. Group visits to National Gallery and Tate Britain were conducted. Discussion on modern art and paintings were also held during the visit to the art exhibition by Artist Jose Antony at the Tate gallery. Special episodes were held to pay tribute to ONV Kurup and Narayana Panicker during which their poetry were discussed.

The 6th edition of the 'Chaya" magazine was published and the winner of 2015 Poetry Competition Mr. K Hashim were honoured during the autumn special episode held in November. A special edition Kattankappi was held to honour the Late Kalabhavan Mani following his sad and



unexpected demise. The artists of the UK made Malayalam movie 'Bilathi Pranayam' were also felicitated and a discussion on 'Avenues of Democracy' were also conducted.

60+ Sisters Club

The Club meets every Tuesday, and over 25 members use its services. This service is an example of how volunteers can play a crucial role in providing essential, high-quality services to vulnerable members of our community. As a result of this service by MAUK, older women can freely talk with each other, sing, dance, organise their entertainment, do light exercise, and most importantly, they have formed a strong support network for each other.

The members also go on day trips on special occasions. Those who attend this group have gained confidence enough to even perform at public functions. The benefits of these projects can most certainly be seen in the improved quality of the lives of the attendees. MAUK took this opportunity to appreciate Director Rajeswari Sadasivan and other volunteers to maintain one of our main and essential service.

MAUK School for Music and Dance

The Schools is providing and maintaining good service for the students attending our music and dance classes. One reason for this improvement is the way of teaching to the standard by good quality teachers. It has led to the students to attend musical and dance examinations from external exam bodies like Trinity College of Music, Oriental Fine Arts Academy of London (OFAAL) and Oriental Examination Board London OEBL.

Bharathanatyam

The classes take place every Saturday from 9 am to noon under the tutelage of Ms Santosh G Nair. Students have not only achieved the good level of Bharathanatyam but also have graded from OFAAL and OEBL. The students have performed at the Onam 2016, Kerala Carnival and also at events organised by other organisations.

Keyboard & Guitar

In 2016 the number of students attending the keyboard and guitar classes has increased. The classes take place on Saturdays from 3 pm to 5 pm and Sundays from 2.30 pm to 6.30pm. We have students from the



age of 5 to 60 years. Well-known musician and music composer, Mr Albert Vijayan, train the students of MAUK. He has performed in mega shows in UK, India and other countries. This year various students have passed grading exams with excellent results. We would like to thank Albert Vijayan for his commitment to developing the music skills of the students.

Tabla and Mridangam

Tabla and Mridangam classes also saw an increase in new students. This year the classes attracted many students from outside the Malayalee community. The students have the flexibility to attend classes in the evenings on weekdays and weekends. The classes are run by Mr Vinodkumar who is a percussionist and was a key player in the well-known orchestra in Kerala called "Navadhara". He is also a key player in MAUK's orchestra troupe "Nisari". MAUK thank him for his dedication in running these classes.

The Chenda classes started in 2011 have seen a steady increase in the number of students. The students of MAUK were fortunate to perform in various stages all over the UK ranging from temples, churches, and the spectacular program for the Independence Day celebrations by High Commission of India. One of the uniqueness of the MAUK Chenda team is that the majority of artists are female. Vinodkumar conducts the Chenda lessons. Club 150

The aim of Club 150 is to raise awareness of diabetes and cardiovascular diseases and provide an exercise based prevention programme to those who are at risk of contracting these diseases. The scheme was initiated by Newham Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) and delivered to the local community by a consortium of local organisations is supported by West Ham United Foundation. Director Ravendran Nair represents MAUK in this consortium is in charge of delivering this service to the local community in Manor Park area.

MAUK brought the awareness to the members on a weekly basis by providing fitness and physical activities has aimed to empower local



people and enable them to take greater control of their own health.

Thalamura

This new weekly service was started by MAUK members who have recently retired from their jobs. Thalamura aims to provide a weekly gathering of community members with activities such as light exercise, playing cards, Kerala style cookery, discussion forums etc.

Thalamura meets every fortnight on Fridays. Since the Club 150 activities take place on the same day, participants of Thalamura also have the opportunity to participate in both. MAUK is looking for more members and volunteers to join the activities of Thalamura. MAUK is taking this opportunity to thank Suresh Sukumaran who initiated and is also the Lead Volunteer for this project.

Badminton 2016

This year's MAUK badminton tournament was held on 19th March 2016 at Newham Leisure Centre, Prince Regents Lane, London E13 8SD.

A total of 20 teams from across the UK participated in this event. Rajeev and Reis secured won the doubles tournament. Sanesh and Aneesh became the runners-up. Joby and Kiran secured the third position. All the winners awarded with cash prize and trophies. MAUK thank all the participants and volunteers who made the event successful.
